Re: Effort Reporting System – Base Release 9.1

We are pleased to announce the availability of Release 9.1 of the base Effort Reporting System. This is a major release, which includes several enhancements and improvements, as well as bug fixes

- Internally, ERS has been upgraded to use the latest release of Hibernate, 3.2.
- Performance has been improved for the FS and PAR interface jobs, and for Report Generation. The Late pay batch job also benefits from these changes.
- The following enhancements are also included:
  - o 582r Overdue reports notification to PIs.
  - o 1279 Reports zeroed out are never re-evaluated if no late pay is processed.
    - This problem is fixed by adding a new "Adjustment Required" status. When a report with generated effort above-the-line is edited to move such effort below-the-line, the new version of the report will have this status.
    - ERS also adds a new filter category to the Report List status filter set to find these reports. "ALL-Adjustment Required" finds both Certified/Adjustment Required and Adjustment Required report in the current list, while "Adjustment Required" finds only the reports with the new status.
  - 1452 Allow comment when administratively changing report from adjustment required to certified.

A complete summary of the changes in this release can be found at the <u>Changes</u> link on the ERS Project Website, and in a README found in the /EffortReporting/WEB-INF/classes directory.

### **Documentation changes**

The *Customization Guide* and the *Installation Guide* have been updated for this release. New versions of these documents are included with the release materials.

## **Configuration Files**

The ERSConfig.xml file has not changed; however, as a result of the upgrade to Hibernate 3.2, your hibernate connection properties file must change. The required changes are documented in the *Customization Guide*, and the sample file included with the release is updated as well.

# **Interface Process Changes**

With Release 9.1, there are no changes to any interface process file specification. However, due to the performance enhancements, the affected interface and generate jobs now require a substantial amount of heap space. See the Installation and Operations Guide for details.

### **Database Changes**

There are structure changes and additional base installation data inserts with this release. See the ERS\_R9-1\_UPGRADE... script corresponding to your DMBS vendor. We strongly recommend taking a backup of your current database before applying this script, since it drops two tables after transferring their data to another table; if you experience errors during this process, you will then be able to restore the needed data.

### **Installation Instructions**

- 1. Backup /campus/<campusname> web customization folder (if used) and other configuration files
- 2. Download the release WAR file and deploy using the application server deployment tool.
- 3. Restore /campus/<campusname> web customization folder, if used, after comparing to identify new and changed elements of the ERS skin.
- 4. NB: if you are using a tomcat application server, you have to modify your catalina.sh script to set a environmental variable on the catalina JVM:
  - a. CATALINA\_OPTS=-Djava.awt.headless=true
- 5. Perform campus release testing.

# Timing of Installation

Installation of this release is <u>not urgent</u>. As usual, campuses are encouraged to install this release in as timely a fashion as possible, and in the normal numeric sequence of releases.

#### Release Sunset

With this release, ERS is retiring support branch 8.2. Base ERS will no longer release any fixes or enhancements to the 8.2 support branch.
